American Indian Family Center

The American Indian Family Center is a non-profit group that provides American Indian families with programs and services enriched by traditional American Indian values and culture. The organization started in 1996 with 2 employees, and has since grown to a staff of 40.

The American Indian Family Center provides therapeutic, employment, family and youth, and educational services to its families. These programs are culturally specific to help connect families with their cultural past and traditions. Statistics show that the American Indian population has a lower life expectancy, is more likely to face domestic violence issues, and has a higher school dropout rate compared to other ethnic groups, and the American Indian Family Center tailors its programs to help improve these ethnic disparities.

The American Indian Family Center currently serves metro families in Ramsey, Anoka, Washington, and Dakota counties. They are currently working on programs that will help serve families in outstate areas. Much of their funding comes through county, state, and federal grants, and the organization is working on additional fundraising.
