SCORE was previously known as the Service Corps of Retired Executives but is now recognized as SCORE, “Counselors to America’s Small Business”. It is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides free business mentoring services to entrepreneurs in the United States. There are five Chapters in Minnesota, including the St. Paul Chapter. The St. Paul Chapter consists of 96 members, many of whom are young professionals in their chosen field. The St. Paul SCORE serves over 1,200 new clients per year. Their mission is to help aspiring and existing businesses succeed. SCORE has a Mentoring program with face to face meeting between a SCORE volunteer and a client; Workshops which provide training sessions from business planning to marketing and finance; a Roundtable which provides facilitated peer sessions to discuss peer to peer business details; a Workshop which provides training sessions from business planning to marketing and finance.
