Remember that many of your club members gather for a friendly adult beverage and fun conversation each Friday afternoon at Rudy's at 5:01 or thereabouts. Spouses and friends are welcome and it counts as a make-up if we have at least 5 members present so come on over!

PROGRAM: Chuck Sandstrom introduced today's speaker and Chanhassen Rotary Club member, Greg Krauska, to up-date us on the ShelterBox program. Greg is a volunteer member and representative of ShelterBox USA which is a partner of ShelterBox International and a recognized project of Rotary International. The program was started in 2000 in the town of Helston, Cornwall, UK as a millennium service project. It involves the purchase of supplies including a heavy duty shelter tent, food preparation equipment, a stove, tools, blankets, water filtration devices and other survival supplies all packed in a heavy duty plastic container ready for rapid deployment to natural or political disaster sites (there are currently over 60 million political refugees world -wide). The first consignment of 143 boxes was sent to victims of the 2001 earthquake in Gujarat, India and by 2004, over 2600 ShelterBoxes were deployed to 16 disaster or refugee sites. The program with the slogan "Shelter -Warmth - Dignity" has grown rapidly and has been recognized as a RI project for many years.

In order to be flexible and ensure rapid deployment ShelterBoxes are prepositioned in 10 to 12 locations throughout the world and since its inception ShelterBox International has served 95 locations through the service of volunteers and transportation partners. The largest assistance projects have been the Port au Prince earthquake in Haiti and the tsunami in the Indian Ocean. ShelterBox works closely with the United Nations, other Non-governmental organizations as well as local and national disaster relief authorities to ensure rapid response and coordination.

Greg described the role of volunteer response teams who are trained and deployed to locations for up to three weeks. Their training includes safety, task completion, sponsor representation, direct aid as well as self-recovery, resilience techniques and education. ShelterBox International receives about one half of its funding from the UK and the remainder from affiliates including RI. ShelterBox USA is a 501(c)(3) organization serving in partnership with ShelterBox International.
