Rotary is all about impact in the world and our communities (through projects, global exchanges, and on).

Perez said he never envisioned becoming district governor when he first joined Rotary. Now, he said, his focus has been in making lasting change — and helping clubs continue to do the same.

Rotary's theme this year — "Rotary connects the world — has underpinnings. Grow Rotary through fellowship and service projects, for example. Grow the foundation's reach, through the number and size of projects and collaboration. And, drilling down, growing the district, with veteran governors and leaders continuing to pursue the principles that make Rotary strong. Perez also talked about core tenants within this framework: diversity, leadership, service and membership, and asked us to reflect on how we are doing in those areas as a club.

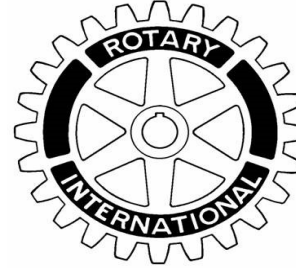

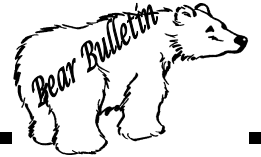
