Program: Ryan Boog presents Amanda LaGrange, CEO of Tech Dump and Tech Discounts

Amanda has been CEO of these two organizations since 2015. Tech Dump is a 501-c-3 organization that provides electronics recycling services for businesses and organizations of all sizes. Since 2011, they have processed more than 30 million pounds of electronic waste. In addition, Tech Dump operates a workforce development program to build skills, confidence, and work experience and employment for persons facing barriers to employment, particularly those who have been incarcerated. They believe strongly in the value of every person and the need to bring back a sense of humanity in our community. As a recycler, Tech Dump has two recycling drop off sites, holds on-site collection events, provides hard drive shredding and data destruction. Through Tech Discounts, their e-commerce spin-off, they offer great deals on refurbished electronics.

Tech Dump's workforce development program runs for 18 months, teaching life skills and job-specific skills, providing job certifications, and assisting with eliminating barriers to employment such as housing and transportation. They have approximately 30 transitional, paid, on-the-job trainees and 37 long term paid employees. For each \$1 spent on a trainee, there is a return on investment of \$9 after the 18- month training program. Trainees start at \$11/hour and by the end of the 18 months are earning \$15.50/hour.

Tech Dump recently announced a partnership with Ramsey County, using some of the federal CARES dollars, to provide TechPaks for people whose employment has been impacted by COVID-19. They are looking for surplus laptops to be refurbished and included in these kits which are designed to help people access job-finding and training information.

Amanda encouraged all businesses to review their practices to ensure they recognize the value all individuals bring to our community and to look at how we can factor in local, social benefits into our personal spending.
