PROGRAM: Club Members Rita Pechmann with Lake Area Bank and **Bob Morse with Mid Country Bank on Community Banking**

Community banks have less than \$1 billion in assets. They consist of over 90% of all banks, hold 75% of all business loans, and hold about 80% of all agriculture loans. Rita ticked off the 5 C's of community banking: color, cut, clarity wait, make that community, character, cash flow, capital, and conditions. There are 4,791 community banks in the nation, down from over 13,000 in the recent past. There are 268 in Minnesota. Community banks place emphasis on local clients and they try to keep it simple, according to Bob. They "sell money" which contributes to local business growth and they do it with multi-purpose client relationships and a variety of accounts per banking relationship. These are the core deposits that are dependable and essential to community bank success. Both Mid Country and Lake Area stepped up big for existing and new business clients when COVID-19 opened up the PPP loan program to US businesses. Community banks provided 60% of all PPP loans to US businesses. Mid Country provided 814 loans totaling \$89 million and Lake Area provided 334 loans totaling \$41 million in the two rounds of loan offerings. Trends for the future include smaller brick and mortar bank footprint, with more emphasis on technology. There is also a trend toward bank consolidations as evidence by Lake Area Bank being recently acquired. Thank you, Rita and Bob for making Community Banking such a riveting topic!
