SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

PROGRAM: BSA Troop 494, White Bear Lake

Ken Baltzer welcomed Eric Stetz, Committee Chair, and Joe Mikkelson, Assistant Scoutmaster, to Rotary, and reminded Club members that the Rotary Club of White Bear Lake chartered this troop in April 1994. He introduced his grandson, Logan, who is the elected Senior Patrol Leader. We also heard from Rick Koskie, Scoutmaster; Becky Baltzer (Ken's daughter-in-law), one of the adult committee members; and Nathan, another Scout. Logan commented that the troop is led by Scouts and assisted by adults. His role is to make decisions and lead the troop.

Troop 494 currently has 35 Scouts, ages 11-17, including one girl, and 19 adult volunteers. The troop meets weekly at St. Stephen Lutheran Church, camps once a month, and has longer adventure camp experiences in the summer and winter. Scouts are involved in a number of community service activities – Strive races, Marketfest, the compost site, the parks, clearing buckthorn, Feed My Starving Children, etc. Through their work on a variety of merit badges they gain problem solving and conflict resolution skills, public speaking experience, and develop leadership qualities. Many return as troop leaders.

Becky gave a picture of the Troop's finances and explained how funds raised through the sales of popcorn and wreaths are allocated between the general fund and the individual Scout's fund to go towards personal camping expenses. She also described the equipment owned by the Troop, tents and camp kitchens that can host 60 people but much of which is 27 year old and in need of replacement.

The young men who presented their personal Scouting stories were impressive – and as future Eagle Scouts have a bright future as community leaders – and Rotarians! On behalf of the Community Service Team, **Darrell Stone** thanked them and presented them with a contribution from our Club.
