Program: Afton Alps and Where Epic Begins

Derrek Skeie introduced Lindsay Thompson, Ski and Snowboard School Manager, Afton Alps.

Lindsey first went skiing in 6th grade on a school trip to Afton (they still host school trips). She loves winter and winter sports and told members her office includes a ski chalet and ski hill.

Afton by the numbers: 300 skiable acres; 353 vertical feet; 52 trails; 17 chair lifts; 1 rope tow, and they hire 1,000 people in the winter. In the summer they employ 100 people and operate an 18-hole golf course, foot golf and Frisbee golf. The average age of skiers is 30-33 years of age and snowboarders are much younger.

Their tag line is "Where Epic Begins." Vail purchased Afton (and several other ski resorts) about six years ago with the hope of getting people involved in skiing and hopefully out to visit their other properties.

Vail currently has 20 properties and with the upcoming purchase of Peak Resorts will double their holdings to about 40.

Vail's mission (and what they strive to provide) is "Experience of a Lifetime." Their goal is to "Re-imagine the mountain experience around the world." In addition to properties in the US, they have properties in Canada and are looking at adding additional properties around the world.

Vail values include:

Be Safe – with a focus on both employees and customers.

Do Good – especially for the environment, etc.

Do Right - act with integrity,

Have Fun - ensure customers (and staff) enjoy themselves.

Serve Others - including customers, fellow employees, and the community.

Drive Value - bring money into the business.

A new employee initiative focused on women and leadership and building an inclusive culture is called POWDER -- Provide Opportunity for Women through Diversity, Equality and Respect. The group of 17 women, all Vail employees throughout the enterprise, includes a book club component, leadership workshops and regular meetings.

The EPIC Promise Foundation is 10 years old. One focus is on the environment with a commitment to reduce Vail's net operating footprint by 2030.

Vail partners with non-profits and encourages employees to donate their time to help provide community support. They give over \$8.5 million annually to support the community and work with 250 non-profit partners.

The foundation supports employees three ways: through college scholarships, employee educational assistance, and emergency relief (ie. three employees at Afton received grants to help with emergency situations).

PROGRAM: Afton Alps (continued)

Afton needs snow to be successful and has 40-some snow making machines. Lasts year they tested two new automated snow making machines and ended up buying three of them. The machines sense the temperature of the air, humidity and water and automatically adjust to the conditions while making snow – all without direct human oversight. The machines operate overnight and provide about four-times as much higher quality snow than their non-automated snow machines. Snow making starts on Nov. 1 when Afton is allowed to start making snow.

A Epic Pass costs about \$900 (or so) and provides access to all Vail properties - Colorado, California, Vermont, Minnesota, Washington, Australia, etc. It also provides access to additional resorts around the world. Lindsay said if you were to ski every day on your Epic Pass you would run out of the winter before you ran out of places to ski.

For a great start to your ski experience, she suggests taking lessons at Afton. They have a Bunny Hills Basics program from 4 PM to close. Participants go from station to station learning about skiing and then they give it a try for less than \$50. Afton also offers kids programs, a Learn to Ski program, a Ski Academy (for men or women), and more. Lindsay finished with An Epic Thank You and encouraged Rotarians to Celebrate an Epic Day.
