Sarah Markoe-Hanson, White Bear Lake Area Historical Society

The society encompasses all the communities that touch the shores of the lake. In connecting our community to its past, the society gathers, maintains, and preserves historical records and artifacts. They scan and digitize records. Pre-Covid, all events were live and lively and fun but they have shifted begrudgingly to still lively virtual programs. The society started years ago with the preservation of the Fillebrown House. Since then, they have been very active in preserving White Bear Town Hall. The society is encouraging a student history club. The society was very active in the detailed process of the WB Armory getting registered as a national historical site. They have tried to get to the bottom of why Indian mounds east of Hwy. 61 near Clark St. were removed. According to Sarah, the beauty of history is that it never stops accumulating. Largest of mounds was on her great grandfather's property. Set of records and court documents at the MN history center help tell the story of why the mound site was eliminated. They have tried to diffuse various myths surrounding the mound history. They have found outside perspectives that may help set the record straight, to some degree. First person resources are the most valuable source of information. Court case was 200 plus pages. Obstructions in the road alongside of the mounds were analyzed more closely by the city and when the court case had been decided, they concentrated on removing obstacles in the existing road to make it safer and contents of the mound were reburied in a local cemetery. The society's gangster tours have been very popular and tell the story of their presence in the area. The society will be running a summer history camp for kids. The camp will inspire and engage curious minds through the STEM (Science, technology, engineering, mathematics) learning process. Hands-on interactive programs incorporate discovery through historical themes that center on local history. Located at the historic White Bear Town Hall, the White Bear Lake Area Historical Society's day camp setting plans to provide a fun and unique way for students entering grades 3-6 to experience the White Bear area as it was in the past.
