Tim is a five-year WB Rotarian and serves as Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations for the White Bear Lake Area School District. At the age of 17 at home in Moorhead, MN, he was mentored in the ways of Rotary in Fargo by Fred Scheel, (Scheel's Sporting Goods) and said he likes the Rotary tradition of singing at meetings. The rest of Tim's classification time was reserved for the: YouLead program run by Irina Fursman. As it applies to our club, YouLead is bringing 18 Ukrainian students to our area as part of a global synergy effort focusing on leadership. They will be accompanied by four chaperones and the group is from Odesa, Kharkiv, and Boryspil. Tim announced that host families have been procured for six students so far. They need more host families for the five-week program as White Bear Lake is hosting nine total with the cities of Hopkins and Osseo helping with the rest. The group needs host families and back-up hosts for shorter periods as well as transportation to and from daily activities, maybe three or drivers/vehicles, morning and evening. They are also needing someone to coordinate the transportation effort. For this five-week period, YouLead could use club members willing to help to be part of a committee to help organize the Ukrainian's August 10-September 15 visit. Keep in mind that these are short-term tasks that we can help with right now. Contact Greg Bartz, Mike Lovett, Bob Timmons, or Tim Wald if can join this effort.



#### **PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 8/3/22 :**

Val Rae Boe Presents: Students with Disabilities in Partnerships with Local Businesses, Danya Troxel and Chris McDonald

Rotarian, Val Rae Boe, Superintendent of the 916 Special Intermediate School District, introduced Danya and Chris who work in the Career and **Technical Services area of the district**, helping students with special needs learn to be employable. They have been working for many years as work coordinators and developers. Chris started out by explaining that students usually start out in non-paid positions and move on the paid positions as they become more gualified. Their job is to set up special needs students who have individualized education plans become trusted employees in the community. Right now, jobs these students are filling are heavy in the custodial service and food service areas, but the program is striving for a more diverse set of jobs to offer the students. The kids learn worksite prep, worksite safety, work readiness, behavior and attitude control, career guidance, labor law, and tax law. The program includes field trips, job shadowing, virtual work, guest speakers, and work coordination during the 8:00 to 2:00 school day. Danya started a partnership with Emagine Theatres in White Bear Township which provides work experience for students doing cleaning and snow shoveling. These students get training and usually are accompanied by school-provided supervisor, called a job coach. The school district provides transportation to and from the workplace.
