PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 9/07/22:

Patty Hall presents: Jenny Andrews, Executive Director for Malaria Partners, International

Jenny is a long-time Rotarian and past president of the Bellevue Breakfast Rotary Club. She combines extensive non-profit development leadership with private sector entrepreneurial experience. She has a degree in Biological Science Education and a Master's degree in Business Administration.

Malaria Partners, International was founded by Rotarians and much of its board consists of Rotarians. There are 247 million cases of Malaria in the world every year, 627,000 deaths with 94% of cases occurring in sub-Saharan Africa. Most victims of the disease are young children. Malaria causes extreme anemia and is very deadly, but at the same time preventable, and is easily treated. It is spread by the bite of a female mosquito when the mosquito bites an infected person and then bites someone else. The person's liver gets infected which affects their red blood cells, causing anemia. Treatment consists of taking two pills three times a day for three days. This eliminates the parasite and protects the person for three months. In Africa, medication supply chain issues are a major problem and causes hoarding and shortages.

Prevention and treatment includes a three-pronged approach. First is vector control where insecticide is used in bed nets and in the community and then cleaning up the environment to eliminate breeding sites. Second is education and trying to overcome illiteracy and false belief systems about causes of the disease. Third is training and empowering community health workers to do door-to-door testing and treatment where needed most. MPI is working to get everything that community health workers need to fulfill their role in preventing and treating the disease and much help comes from World Vision, The Gates Foundation, and many other organizations who provide small grants to the program. The current president of RI, Jen Jones recently spent ten days in Zambia with MPI and is really behind their mission. MPI is looking to build a strong Rotary support system for not only Zambia and Uganda, but also 10 or 12 other African countries. They educate about diarrheal diseases and pneumonia also. MPI is helping to save lives but is working towards eradication of Malaria. Although vaccines will not solve the problem right now, a lot of research is being done.
