<u>Program:</u> Brian Collins, Challenge Incarceration Program Assistant commissioner of the Department of Corrections in Minnesota

Collins said CIP is a great service, and has helped people in prison become successful on the outside. It is an early release program. It is about self-redemption and positively impacting the world — so it aligns with Rotary values. Program was created in 1992 and is modeled after military boot camp. Phase one is at one of three facilities, one of which is for women, in Shakopee. (Brian is at one, Willow River.) There is focus on restorative justice, self-worth, and mind and body work. It lasts 180 days.

Phase two and three send people into the community, and people are put into employment or education, or a combination of both. There also is a treatment component. The program found that substantially decreased chance for return to prison for the people who participated. It also has limited budget pressures by reducing th

Brian showed a video with CIP participants and its regimented approach. Several spoke of its positive impact on their lives, a renewed feeling of worth and integrity.

There is work on supporting the participants in what they exactly need — from housing to treatment to employment. There is an emphasis on a need to individualize it because they've seen that be most-effective for success in the program.

Classification: Ellen Hiniker, City Manager

Ellen said her family has passed down pride of Irish heritage, especially from her mother, who recently died. Ellen has three children, Sam, Lizzy and John, 21 to 25, making her extremely proud. She also posted an image of her large family. She has two sons from her second marriage.

Ellen is a WBL alum. Her focus was music, singing and playing. That led to pursue music at St. Kate's, and pivoted to UW-Eau Claire and got degrees in political science and German. After college, she moved to the Humphrey Institute and got a degree in public policy with an emphasis on nonprofit management. In 1990 she got an internship at the city of White Bear Lake. Work and experiences deepened; then she took a detour to work for a political consultant in Madison. Then after a year she and her fiance at the time came back to White Bear. She went back to the city and worked with Mark Sather as an assistant. Spent a decade caring for her children, and then took another job at the city in 2008. Mark retired, and Ellen became city manager in 2016. She said the recent years personally and professionally have been "fast and furious" but she relishes the growth found in it all.

Regarding the pandemic, the city business also was thrown into quick adaptations to protect employees and provide services. The city also has worked to support businesses.
