Classification Time: PDG Jim Hunt presented a brief tutorial on the RI Twin Club program. Twin Clubs are two Rotary clubs from different countries that form a long-term relationship to promote international understanding, good will and carry out meaningful service projects. Following introduction of the program at the 1991 RI Conference in Mexico City Jamaican PDG Charlie Braham and WBL President-elect Bob Anderson met to discuss forming a Twin Club relationship which progressed further through the leadership of Kingston Club President Paul Morgan and WBL Club President Bob Anderson.

The new relationship led to an initial service project through which WBL raised funds to assist with building playground equipment at the Hope Valley Experimental School where children with disabilities are mainstreamed in their educational classes. In 1992 Rotary Club of Kingston (RCOK) members Desmond Creary and Paul Morgan visited WBL and other district clubs and plans evolved for "Hands On" service projects in Jamaica. The first involved several WBL members traveling to Kingston to build access ramps at the Hope Valley School and over the next several years WBL work crews traveled to Kingston for painting and repair projects. RCOK members Andre Hylton, Scarlette Gillings and Effion Whyle visited WBL and plans for fund raising and matching grant applications for other projects to provide 10K books and several musical instruments for Kingstion schools were developed. With the advent of Zoom meetings the clubs have now been allowed to attend each others meetings further securing this great relationship which will soon enter its 30th year.

Jim planted a seed that the 30th anniversary in 2022 would be a good occasion to renewal of exchange projects. Thanks Jim.

Program: Janelle Erickson introduced todays program on the work of the Tiny Lives Foundation (TLF) in Lesotho, Africa. She first called upon Ellen Block a professor of anthropology and sociology at St. Benedict/St. Johns and board member of the TLF. She explained that Lesotho is an enclaved country within the border of South Africa and a former British colony receiving independence 1966. It has a population of 2.1 million which is 75 percent rural and 50 percent exist in poverty. One of ten children die before their 5th birthday and 42 percent of children suffer from malnutrition. The country has the 2nd highest concentration of HIV/ AIDS in the world with 24% of its adult population infected of which 58% are female. Social norms lead to the high transmission rate to women and children. Severe drought in this agricultural economy has led to food shortage since 2018 and COVID-19 is spreading rapidly.

To provide assistance to stressed region the Foundation developed its Touching Tiny Lives (TTL) project with the motto "Saving one child at a time." Ellen introduced via internet M'e Nthabeleng from Lesotho to describe the work of the TTL project including a safe home, parenting education, medical outreach and community building. Over the past year the safe home has provided housing, nutrition and health care to 26 children. Through the outreach activities local women provide parenting education, HIV/AIDS awareness, improved hygiene and access to medical care. While health conditions remain serious, through approximately 900 home visits and care provided to 2400 children, improvement has been made. Access to medications, nourishment and education has reduced mother to newborn AIDS transmission and improved nutrition.
