Michael Lovett used his classification time to discuss the 2020 Taste of White Bear, which will take place on September 12, 2020. PROGRAM: . Faynesse Miller, President of Hamline University

Dr. Faynesse Miller, the President of Hamline University since 2015, gave an excellent presentation on how the Covid Pandemic has affected Hamline University. Hamline had an emergency plan in place since the bird flu pandemic and was able to swiftly put together an emergency team. Instead of closing the entire campus, Hamline allowed 250 students to remain on campus and relocated them single room dorms. The cafeteria remained open to provide pickup meals and a food panty was established. A mental health service was established for both on and off campus students. Within 2 weeks Hamline faculty pulled together an online remote classroom platform and purchase laptops and hot spots for students. There are many challenges ahead for the upcoming fall semester. If students can be on campus, Hamline faces whether it will have enough classroom space for social distancing as well as safe and compliant dorm space. A major concern is that Hamline does not have the ability to test for the Covid Virus. The Minnesota Department of Health has told them that they are on their own regarding testing. such, Hamline may have to establish its own testing stations and lab facilities. Hamline did receive \$2.5 from the CARES Act of which \$1 Million was distributed to students. 32% of the students are students of color, many of whom need to work 2-3 jobs. It is estimated that 20% or more of its existing students will not return. This will affect Hamline's operating budget because student tuition pays 80% of the budget. Dr. Miller, thank you for this excellent presentation and we wish you, Hamline students and faculty all the best in these uncertain times.
