 Rotarian Magazine January 2022 PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 2/16/22: A Week of Minnesota Get-Together for North Korean Refugee Families in the U.S.— Presented by Mike Lovett The inspiration for this project came from Haesook Koo, who Mike and Sylvia Lovett met a number of years ago at the University of Minnesota. It is Haesook's dream to reunite North and South Korea. Together with Sylvia, she developed the concept of a family camp based on a model of "grass-roots intergroup (or inter-ethnic) dialogue" - a low cost peace-building tool to create understanding, empathy, acceptance of the other, and peaceful engagement among participants. The model has been used since the ear-Iv 1990s to bring together East-West Germans, Palestinians and Israelis, and in South Africa. Mike's understanding of the situation was deepened when visiting Seoul and travelling to the DMZ and realizing they are still at war in the Korean peninsula. Minnesota has a history of relationships with Korea, through the University of Minnesota, and through the large number of Korean adoptees in our state, providing a good foundation for piloting this program in Minnesota. The plan: to host a resident camp for North Korean refugee families in the U.S. that would bring them together and provide interactions with South Koreans, Korean-Americans living in Minnesota, and volunteers from Rotary and other groups such as the YMCA. The camp was held August 8-13, 2021, at YMCA Camp St. Croix, with a total of 24 participants: 14 members of North Korean refuge families from around the US; 4 Korean Americans associated with a nonprofit, 3 representatives of WBL Rotary and 3 YMCA staff

The WBL club donation of \$3,000, plus funds from five other clubs and a district grant, netted \$12,000; the YMCA covered some of the costs of the camp; and other funds were raised to help bring the families to Minnesota. Through the arts, through informal and structured conversations, there were many emotional and healing moments for all who participated. Kevin and Molly Donovan, Greg Bartz, and Chris Streiff shared their thoughts on the experience of being a part of the camp. As expressed by one of the North Korean men, "We can't go back home again, but this week has been like going home again." And as Haesook wrote, "What a magical summer. There is no other word than "miracle" in describing my experience...my eyes still get teary in thinking of those magical moments watching North Korean refugees building their sense of **coming home** with each other."

As a follow-up to the camp, Greg and others have been able to connect some of the participants with Rotary clubs in their local communities. And work continues to find funds for future camps.

Thanks to Mike and all those who worked so hard, particularly in the time of COVID, to make the dream of a family camp a reality!
