Jackie Reis reported on the Minnow Tank Project for 4th graders at Willow Lane Elementary. Twelve teams of students, each working with a Rotary coach, competed for funds for a charity they had researched. The students researched the organization and developed a powerpoint presentation that was creative, informative and passionate and were judged by another group of Rotarians. This project included 19 Rotarian volunteers and 6 friends of Rotary. The Minnow Tank project was sponsored by the E&I Team, Community Service, Vocational, and some generous Rotarian sponsors. The following charities were recognized: Hope For Kids, Minnesota Chapter— \$1,000; University of Minnesota Masonic Cancer Center Fund—\$750: Second Chance Animal Rescue—\$450. Our partner from the school was Leigh Anderson, who supported both the students and teachers in this significant endeavor.

The **BEAR'ly Open** is a cooperative partnership between the Rotary Club of White Bear Lake and White Bear Events to raise money for the White Bear Area Emergency Food Shelf. Join us as we begin our second decade and "claw "our way toward a goal of \$2,000,000. This is an official event of the St. Paul Winter Carnival.

On Saturday, February 5, the golf on ice event at White Bear Lake County Park at Ramsey Beach, features a realistic golf course, complete with pine trees, challenging holes and actual greens with flags making it a great way to have fun, get out of the house and raise money for the Food Shelf. The Community Dance on Friday night, February 4, will once again feature a local favorite, "Wild Cat Combo" playing the best of classic rock and roll.

To date, BEAR'ly Open has contributed over \$242,000 to the Food Shelf. That's \$1.94 million worth of food.

Today we heard from various leaders - on avenues of service. They and all those helping them are "hometown heroes".

**Vocational - Derrek Skeie-** allows members to share their skills with a focus on youth. Support for youth and education is an example. Our strive runs provide scholarships for kids. We recognize weekly academic achievers.

Community Service – John Channon for Darrell Stone – a wide range of projects and activities. Community and environment development and other nonprofit endeavors in our area. We provide financial support, and also strive for hands on projects. Peace poles is an example. We worked on salvaging PCs for those in need.
