Welcome to Guest:

Mike Lovett introduced his guest **Leigh Anderson**. Leigh has been teaching at Willow Elementary school for ten years and recognized for her engagement of the community and businesses in the schools achievements.

Leigh is interested in Rotary due to its public service.

Program:

Mike Lovett introduced today's speaker, Hedy Lemar Walls. Ms. Walls is the Chief Social Responsibility Officer with the YMCA of the North. Mike described her as gracious, respectful and wise. Hedy explained that COVID-19 has been observed to have had a disproportionate impact on the income, educational achievement, employment, home ownership and access to health care for people of color. Following it's mission the Y has historically tried to be sensitive and expositive to social issues but current conditions require extraordinary efforts. To be responsive the Y formed the Equity Innovation Center and recently, through a grant \$5Million from UnitedHealth, the Y of the North has set out to expand this initiative with the development of a framework for a culturally responsive care and an opportunity for collaboration, experience and reflection on health disparity, equity and cultural agility to promote equity and inclusion. The grant has allowed expansion of the Y's Equity Innovation Center through which it works with communities private corporations and organizations on a "Systems Change Model" focused on policies, practices, resource flows, structural change and relationships to accommodate discussion of race, racism and symptoms that feed micro aggression. The model includes an Equity Progress Curve to help organizations determine their progress toward improving social equity. Their work has grown to 14 urban areas nation-wide and has helped communities and organizations begin to move from mono-cultural to multi-cultural perspectives and improved dialogue. She gave examples of successful interventions in two suburban communities in the east metro area.
