Terrell Johnson with Just Love LLC presented. The organization provides child and youth services. He has been doing this work for 30 years.

His passionate words and presentation was on civility. Rotary’s mission of service above self resonates with Terrell’s comments that being civil is a service to our fellow man. One does that by being an active listener. Love is truly listening with the heart. By connecting with people and hearing their story and their issues, in 1:1 interactions where we respect what they say, we further civility. He noted it is wise to “get little before we get big “. It starts with knowing at a personal level what the youth needs, and then broadens. Not all programs or even elements of a program may be a fit. The skills he uses are not to start with what he can do for the youth, it starts with hearing and respecting what their needs are and what their hearts are saying. His work centers on nurturing our youth and reinforcing their unique value and strength. “No one succeeds unless we all succeed” is a fundamental underpinning of civility.
