Toufong talked about his upbringing in Laos -- his father was an aide and advisor to U.S. forces during the Vietnam War, a role that help Toufong and his mother emigrate to the U.S. when he was 5. His dad was missing in action. Toufong went into the Navy, later got degrees from UW Madison and went on to become a police officer for a time in River Falls, Wis. Today, he runs a successful and busy auto service company in White Bear Lake. Maybe his most important role, though, is his leadership in the Hmong community. He is chair of the American Hmong Council, a supreme body made up of representatives of the 17 clans in the U.S. Hmong community. Toufong is fiercely proud of his Hmong ancestry and maybe more so his being an American. He spoke eloquently of his American dream, which has planted his roots firmly in Minnesota.

DID YOU KNOW? WORLD POLIO DAY IS OCTOBER 24

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort. Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

Program: Dylan McDonaugh, Solid Ground

Dylan talked about the nonprofit's chief role: It is "helping people help people." It was formed in the 1980s and its main focus is homelessness and providing services for community members in various ways. It serves all family structures, with various programs around the East Metro and units that house families. Some units host families in transition, while others host families indefinitely. A big goal is to help families so that care-givers then have the stability to keep their kids settled in one school district. There also are support services. Dylan reminded the club that many people who need Solid Ground's support have experienced trauma in some way. Solid Ground helps people find jobs, find housing, find social services support.
